It also profiles other notorious events—including Hurricane Katrina, the Madrid bombings, the SARS outbreak in 2004, and the sarin gas attack in Tokyo in 2005—as seen through the eyes of the expert contributors who witnessed and responded to these tragedies. The book presents the lessons learned from these events by the contributing authors who acted on the front lines of the medical disaster response. It is a valuable reference manual for emergency planning, response, and healthcare professionals to confront future disasters and help prevent and mitigate destruction and unnecessary casualties. A reference for internal medicine and family practice residents, students, and clinicians. It contains over 150 tables, flowcharts, and figures. Emergency Medicine Survival Guide is a book that is very informative and gives a practical approach to medical personnel in the emergency room setting.
